Interest in participating in one of our three cruises is also high, with fifty members attending the Cruise Meeting on May 11<sup>th</sup>. Overviews of the cruises were presented by Dorothy Becker, Cruise Captain of the Cruise to Mystic; by Dave Tedesco, Cruise Captain of the Cruise to the Jersey Shore and by John and Corrine Rambold, leaders of the Week in the Bay Cruise. Adrian and I recently were in Holland to visit with some of her family. It gives her the chance to spend some time with her cousins and maintain her Dutch language skills and it gives me the opportunity to explore the nautical history of another country. The guys took me to visit the Scheepvaart (Sailing Ships) Museum in Sneek and boat yards that have been building wooden sailing vessels since the 1700's. We went to numerous seaside towns and explored ships stores and nautical specialty shops, where I bought a wooden model of a traditional Dutch sailboat, a Hoogaar. It's amazing to see how many boats are out in early spring. I guess sailing in and near the North Sea conditions you to sailing in colder temps.

At most marinas sailboats outnumbered power by a wide margin. Many of the sailboats are of the type we are now accustomed to seeing at boat shows here, names such as Bavaria, Beneteau, Jeanneau and boats from Scandinavia. However, the boats I appreciated most were the traditional Dutch sailing boats. Originally built to transport cargo or used for fishing, old boats are lovingly maintained and new fiberglass versions retain the traditional style. The photo below is of a traditional Dutch sailboat. A sailor certainly feels at home in Holland.

### Commissioning Day (May 31st) SBCC Blessing of the Fleet

Once again our South Bay Cruising Club has gathered here to celebrate our annual Commissioning Day. It's always a nice party for us, when we see old friends and meet some new ones; and we celebrate the things we do well. Sailing is our thing, and we do it well.

We know how to sail; to race, to cruise; and we know how to party. Especially at this party we know how to raise a flag - even with a cannon, as we shall do in just a few minutes. Our flag is green and white, and it symbolizes our enjoyment of sailing, our love of the sea, and our shared values in this little community of the South Bay Cruising Club.

Of course we always hold this party and raise this green and white flag on a day which is special for another flag, which is red, white and blue. Our national flag also carries enormous symbolism for us. The relationships we have developed and continue to develop with local Yacht Clubs are the result of a dedicated effort by everyone involved to expand and promote sailing on the bay. That philosophy goes for every SBCC event on the schedule, join us as often as you can.

## Flotsam & Jetsam

The Editor

Now that the weather has FINALLY changed for the better, it's a good time to pass along information provided by Adrienne Tesoro, especially if you're traveling off The Bay. Do not approach within 100 yards of any U.S. Naval vessel. If you need to pass within 100 yards of a U.S. Naval vessel in order to ensure a safe passage in accordance with the Navigation Rules, you must contact the U.S. Naval vessel or the Coast Guard escort vessel on VHF-FM channel 16. In addition, you must operate at minimum speed within 500 yard of any U.S. Naval vessel and proceed as directed by the Commanding Officer or the official patrol. Violations of the Naval Vessel Protection Zone are a felony offense, punishable by up to **six years in prison** and/or up to **\$250,000 in fines**.
