Jeff remained on board with a bloody shin from something or other and helped me get squared away in a slip deep inside the marina. And finally I got to the clubhouse for fresh coffee, bagels, muffins and fruit!

We're new members of the SBCC, having moved to Bay Shore from Riverhead a year ago, and think the SBCC is great. Thank yous to Della, Jeff, Sue and Bob for helping when needed, and kudos to the club for another wonderful event.

facilities on the bay. The initial goal is to convince local governments, especially Suffolk County, to coordinate and oversee development of a comprehensive plan to provide and maintain pump-out boats designed to come to vessels when needed. The towns of Oyster Bay and Southampton have been very successful with the operation of their pump-out boats. Federal and State funding is available for these boats, however most towns have been reluctant to take action. We believe providing these boats county wide will be much more effective. Toward that goal, the committee recently met with Suffolk County's Director of Environmental Affairs, Michael J. Deering to present our proposal to him and begin a dialogue necessary to move forward with their assistance. While working for the Town of Oyster Bay, Michael Deering was successful in getting their pump-out boat into action. With his support, we will

continue to work with Suffolk County in the future to develop a plan for action.

Long time SBCC Board Member and Governor, Michael Kohl, has resigned from his position on the board. Aside from serving as Governor, Michael and his wife Robin have been constructive and energetic board members in many capacities in their twenty years as club members. I would like to thank both Michael and Robin for their invaluable contribution to our organization. By a unanimous vote at our September Board Meeting, Dave Tedesco was appointed to the position of Governor until the end of the 2005 term. We welcome Dave and appreciate his willingness to volunteer his time

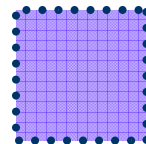
