From the Fleet Surgeon

Prevention is the key to health, and since most of us are unable to get the flu vaccine this year, what better topic. The flu (also called influenza), like the common cold is caused by a virus, no medicine can cure these illnesses, but they can often be prevented by simple measures. The following should help us avoid contracting and spreading these viruses.

- Frequent hand washing, or alcohol-based hand washes when sinks are unavailable.
- Clean surfaces such as doorknobs, faucet or refrigerator handles, and telephones frequently.
- Avoid close contact- especially with those who may be sick.
- Boost your immunity: get plenty of sleep, and exercise; eat healthy meals with plenty of fresh fruit, vegetables, and protein; avoiding refined carbohydrates. Take a multivitamin and Vitamin C daily.
- Avoid touching your face with your hands.
- Most importantly, stay home if you get the flu. Don't be a hero, or you will spread the virus to everyone at work or school, or wherever you go.

If you get hit hard and fast with fever, chills, weakness, tiredness, dry cough, sore throat, runny nose, severe headache, muscle aches and eye pain; chances are you have the flu and it may be time to contact your doctor.

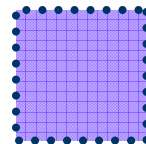
