FROM THE JANUARY 1973 MASTHEAD

"The program at the general meeting was demonstration of gourmet cooking on a two burner marine stove. Mr. Arthur Phillips, a lecturer on northern Italian cooking with considerable experience in the galley of a cruising auxiliary, prepared two dishes in a very short time. Many in the audience wished additional copies of the recipes and they are reproduced below. Our sincere thanks to Mr. Phillips as well as to Gene Reardon for the use of the stove from *Manatuck*.

Saltimbocca - A Roman specialty which means, literally, they jump into your mouth

2 lbs veal scaloppini, each piece about 5" square

1 tsp. dried sage ¼ lb. prosciutto or ham, thin sliced

2 - 3 Tbs. dry white wine 3 Tbs butter

Salt pepper

Sprinkle veal slices with sage and place equal size slice of ham on them. Pin them together with toothpicks. Melt butter and fry meat in it. Season to taste. Cook, covered, over high heat for 2 - 3 minutes on each side until veal is browned. Place slices of cooked meat on heated platter, ham side up. Keep hot. Add wine to pan and scrape bottom. Boil up once.

Scaloppini al Marsala - This is about the same dish as Saltimbocca, except that no ham is used and it is made with Marsala instead of white wine.

Bocconcini - Another variation. A thin slice of Swiss cheese is substituted for the ham.

Risotto Alla Milanese/Risotto Milanese (Lombardy)

In a heavy saucepan, melt 2 Tbs butter with 2 Tbs olive oil. When it is hot stir in 1 cup rice that has been wiped in a clean cloth, but not washed. Let the rice become pale gold in color, stirring it with a fork over moderate heat. Add 1 onion, chopped, and 1 clove of garlic, chopped and mashed. Cook another brief moment and add 1 cup hot chicken stock. Cover the pan closely and cook slowly over low heat for 10 to 20 minutes, or until the liquid is absorbed. Add ½ tsp saffron, or more, according to taste, that has been dissolved in 3 Tbs white wine or Madeira. Now add 2 ½ cups more hot chicken stock stir the rice once with a fork cover closely, and continue cooking until all the liquid is absorbed and the rice is fluffy. Add a lump of butter and ½ cup grated Parmesan, stir very lightly and serve at once.

I am pleased to report that the U.S. Coast Guard and the Department of Transportation were very responsive to our concern regarding the on-going repair and construction of the Robert Moses Bay Bridge. As a result of discussions between all parties with the contractor, it was agreed that all construction in the main span of the bridge will be delayed until after September 11, 2006 with a targeted completion date of May 2007. After that time scaffolding will be installed in the main span that will reduce the vertical clearance by 2.5 feet per the specifications. Additionally the Coast Guard will work with the Department of Transportation to provide for more frequent openings of the Captree draw bridge. Thanks to everyone who made their concern known to the authorities.

The Officers and Board of Governors have worked hard to provide another year of great events for our members. Whether your interest is cruising, racing or both there are events for everyone. Don't let this sailing season go by without taking the opportunity to enjoy the SBCC!

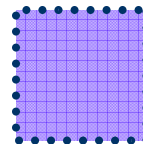
