Well, we've had some very interesting rendezvous and cruises this summer, and I thought it would be fun to put some statistics together. These are current as of September 16.

- To date, we have had 24 rendezvous scheduled
- 2 rendezvous have been cancelled due to the weather
- 1 rendezvous had a change of venue
- 2 rendezvous hosts had to get replacement hosts
- 1 rendezvous host's boat list is missing
- The least number of boats to attend a rendezvous is 1
- The most number of boats to attend a rendezvous is 27
- 28 boats sailed to The Blast
- The average boat attendance per rendezvous is 14
- 70 boats have attended at least one rendezvous!
- 8 boats which attended rendezvous begin with the letter 'M'
- 1 boat has attended 15 rendezvous
- 1 new member has actually volunteered to host a rendezvous next year
- 2 back-to-back September rendezvous had Italian themes
- 8 rendezvous are scheduled in the Connetquot River
- We have had two officially sanctioned SBCC cruises

To me, the most amazing thing is that 71 boats have attended at least one rendezvous. There are 192 boats in the SBCC, including both cruising and racing boats, so that means that approx. 37% of the boats participated in a Club rendezvous.

And did I mention we will be holding a contest for the best apple or pumpkin pie? So please enter your most scrumptious recipe for all of us to taste.

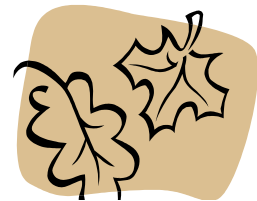
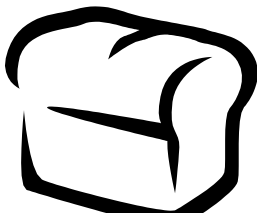
Prizes will be awarded for Best Costume AND Best Pie!

PUMPOUT UPDATE

Talk about being result oriented! The pump out committee has managed to move the mountain, a/k/a Town Hall. Joel Becker began this crusade in 2000, the committee was formed in 2004, and the group's efforts reached the first plateau in late summer when the Town of Islip launched a shiny new pump out boat, the only one of its breed in the Great South Bay. It only got to operate for seven days spread over a few weekends before the season wound down, but its performance exceeded expectations: 1,730 gallons of raw sewage from 119 boats; 28 boats in one day. Wow! Town officials were very impressed.

The Islip boat covered a lot of water, making appearances in the Connetquot River and Fire Island and at all town marinas.

And next year, Islip intends to expand operations and Brookhaven will have two boats. That's two thirds of the towns along Suffolk's Great South Bay. Once word gets around, these boats will make a huge dent in the volume of waste deposited by boaters in our home waters.

The Islip boat can be hailed on channel 73, and the SBCC, as well as the fish, crabs, etc., strongly urge our members to partake of the

free service. We all want a clean Bay. So spread the word and set an example for other boaters. And watch for more of those results from our pump out initiative committee.

Cleaning Up Wreck (Garbage) Cove

Wilfred (Bruce) Kleisler, a long time SBCC member (sailing vessel *Astarte*), was recently honored by the South Shore Estuary Reserve (SSER) organizations for his efforts to bring a greater awareness as well as potential solutions to a problem known as "Wreck Cove". The award honors groups and individuals for innovative projects that inspire others to take action and is awarded to one individual and group per year.

Wreck Cove, also known as Garbage Cove, is located at the south end of the Lindenhurst Cut and has long been a location for abandoned private and commercial vessels and equipment.

Bruce took it upon himself to become familiar with the SSER Comprehensive Management Plan and identified a problem that was not addressed in the plan. Bruce then took the extra step of educating others, offering solutions and bringing people together to address the problem of Wreck Cove.

During a recent meeting of the council we were surprised to learn that SBCC member Bruce Kleisler had been awarded this year's individual Stewardship award for his efforts to bring attention to the abandoned vessels in "Wreck Cove". Congratulations Bruce.

The Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association has been instrumental in keeping the sport alive and well on Great South Bay for a hundred years. The SBCC is pleased to be a long-time member and supporter of this organization. This past year I asked Past Commodore John Davis if he would continue be our representative to GSBYRA and as always he has done an excellent job. Thank you, John.

We have excellent cooperation from the DOT, Coast Guard and the contractor working on the Robert Moses Bridge. As I have reported earlier we had an agreement that the main channel would not be restricted until after September 11th. To date the contractor has not begun work on the center span and the main channel has remained clear. I am checking with the DOT each week for weekend updates and will send an e-mail to members when the channel becomes restricted. However this could happen at any time and I advise all passing under the bridge to look up and make sure you will have adequate vertical clearance.

1 stick butter in chunks on top

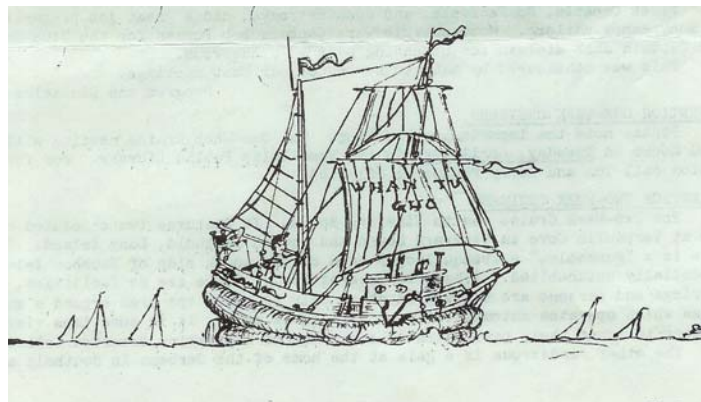
Bake at 350 for 45 min. Let the top brown.

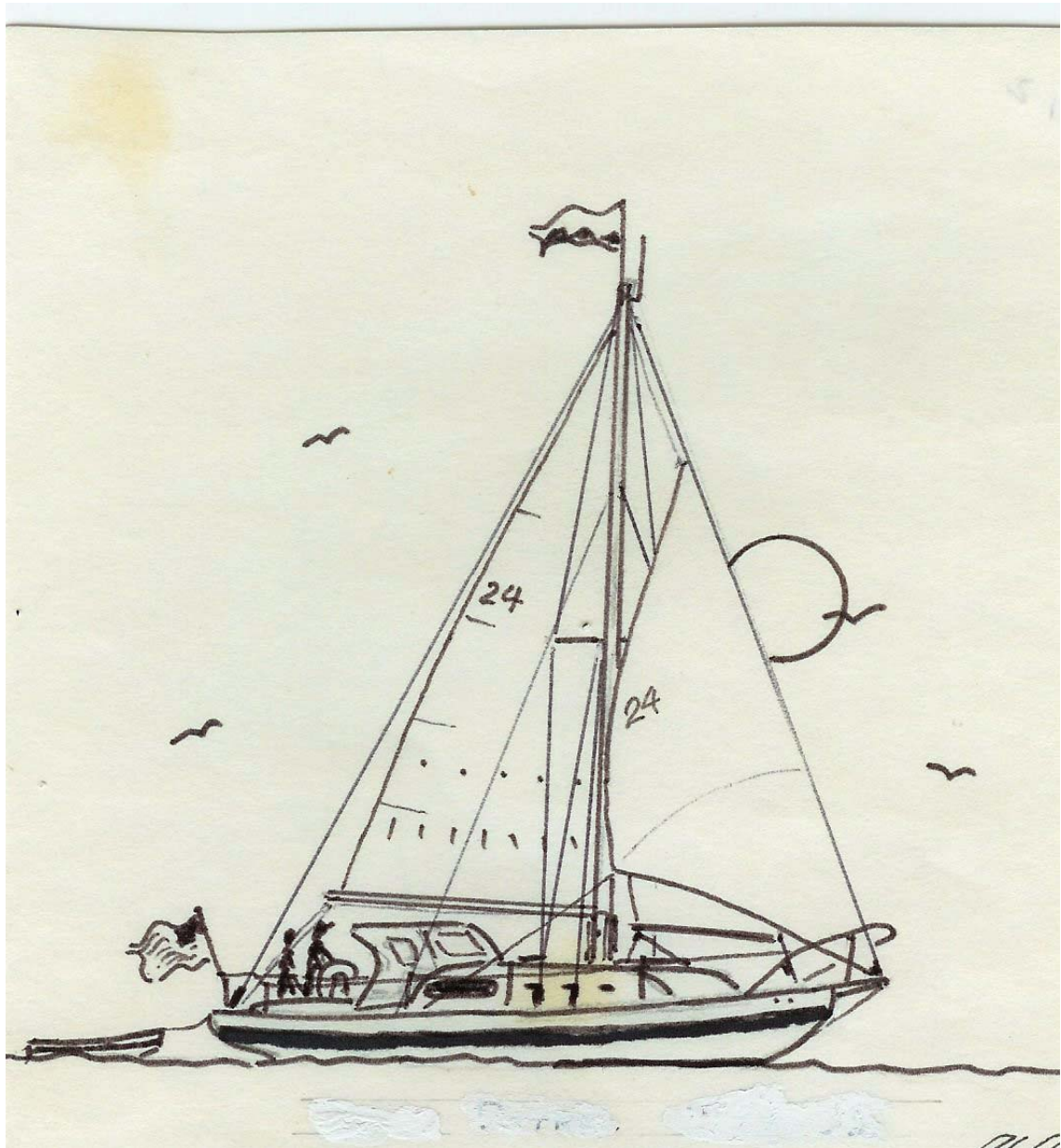
