From the Protest Committee

Hearing Held 19:30, June 4, 2007 at 26 Saxon Avenue, Bay Shore, NY

This is a protest by Boat A against Boat B arising from alleged contact between the boats shortly after the start of the Bay Shore Twilight race held on May 22, 2007.

The committee found that Boat A informed Boat B of her intention to protest by hailing "Protest" in a timely manner and promptly hoisted a red flag. The written protest was received by me (BP) by email effective 9:53 am on Wednesday May 23, 2007.

The content requirements for filing a valid protest are set out in Part 5 of the Racing Rules of Sailing (2005-2008) hereinafter referred to as the "rule(s)". Rule 61.2 requires the protest to, among other things, be in writing, identify who is protesting and who is being protested, describe the incident and state where and when it occurred. There are several other requirements, including stating the rule(s) broken, but these can be met before or during the hearing.

It was the Protest Committee's determination that Boat A either at or during the hearing complied with all aspects of the rule. Unfortunately, this was not determinative.

Since publications of the 2003 Yearbook (the SBCC Notice of Race and Sailing Instruction) VIII Protest & Redress provides as follows:

The Protest Committee will only entertain protests made in conformity to the U.S. Sailing rule 61, 61.1, 61.2 and 61.3. Rule 61.2 Protest Contents, "A protest shall be in writing" is amended to "a protest shall be in writing using only as U.S. Sailing Protest Form" (copies can be downloaded from the SBCC web site or www.ussailing.org. and a copy is sent yearly in the Masthead). *Emphasis added.*

Boat A's written protest was not on a U.S. Sailing Protest Form.

The Rule(s) provide that a local organization can change some but not all of the Racing Rules. Rule 61.1 is one of the rules that can be changed and the SBCC sailing instructions amendment to the rule satisfies the requirements of Rule 8.1(b).

Albeit reluctantly, the Committee found that Boat A's protest was not valid.

CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS: Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

Changes may be made orally on the water.

SCORING: The race will be scored as time on distance.

PRIZES: The Louis H. Orr Jr. Trophy is awarded to the First Place boat in the Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker classes. It remains in the BYC trophy case for display. First, Second, and Third place awards will be given.

BERTHING: Available at the Babylon Yacht Club beginning Saturday September 22nd.

On Labor Day weekend we are invited to the Sayville Yacht Club for Jack's Trophy Race and Rendezvous. This is always a fun event with two days of racing and a great party on Saturday evening at the Sayville Y.C. Many SBCC members who are not racing come by car to the party. I hope to see a strong attendance by the SBCC at this affair.

Last month I wrote that the Coast Guard would be keeping Loran active while further evaluating the need for it. The CG is now seeking comments regarding the future of Loran. You may submit your comments to <http://dms.dot.gov>. The identifying docket number is USCG 2007-28460. I believe that Loran provides an important backup to GPS and should be retained.

If you have been reading the BoatUS news you will have noted that there is consideration to requiring all boats operators to be licensed and our boats to be equipped with expensive automatic identification system (AIS) transponders in the name of national security. While AIS is a great safety tool offshore, providing ship identification, it is not designed to be an anti-terrorism tool against high speed small boats. We all need to keep abreast of this issue.

BoatUS notes two other items of concern. First is the potential introduction of Ethanol into diesel fuel turning a safe fuel into a Class One flammable liquid and potentially damaging our engines, fuel tanks etc. The second involves a federal court decision requiring the EPA to develop a federal pollution permit for recreational boats that discharge engine cooling and bilge water. We all need to keep abreast of these potentially onerous requirements.
