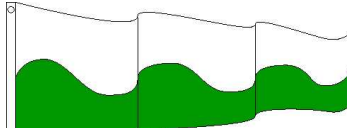

Greetings,

The Foulke Trophy had a record 14 Spinnaker boats this year including Frank Marinaccio's **Cherry Pi**. It is the first time in over 10 year that he has flown a spinnaker on his boat. Congratulations Frank.

There was a question regarding how the start was set up and how the finish was scored for the Foulke Trophy Race. To do a pursuit start the only way to determine that is by Time on Distance. A number of years ago the scoring was changed from a Time on Distance scoring to Time on Time scoring as are all of the other races are scored using Time on Time. If you look at the results this year they were pretty close after 30 miles.

We also have a few new boats here or coming. Kevin Padden now has a white Ericson 38 named **Rettsie**, a nickname his wife Loretta had as a child. Dan McMillan recently purchased a Blue C&C 25 named **Karma** and Conor Hartnett also boat a Red C&C 25 **Firewater II** which was owned by Steve DeLise and then Doug Crocker and Gorty Baldwin a great boat. There might also be two more C&C 25 purchases in the near future. We are currently up to 11 C&C 25's. For some of the other big boat and sport boats you

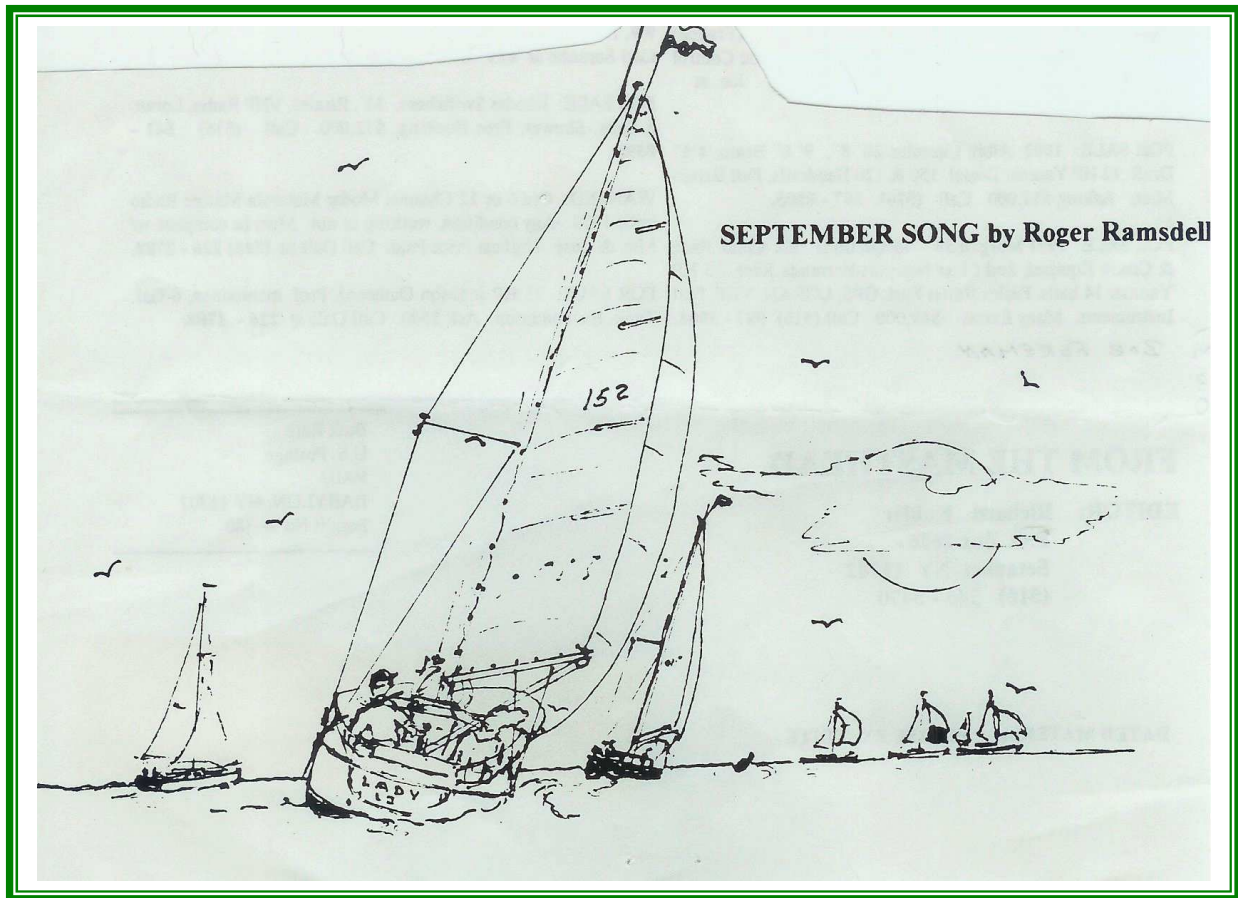
