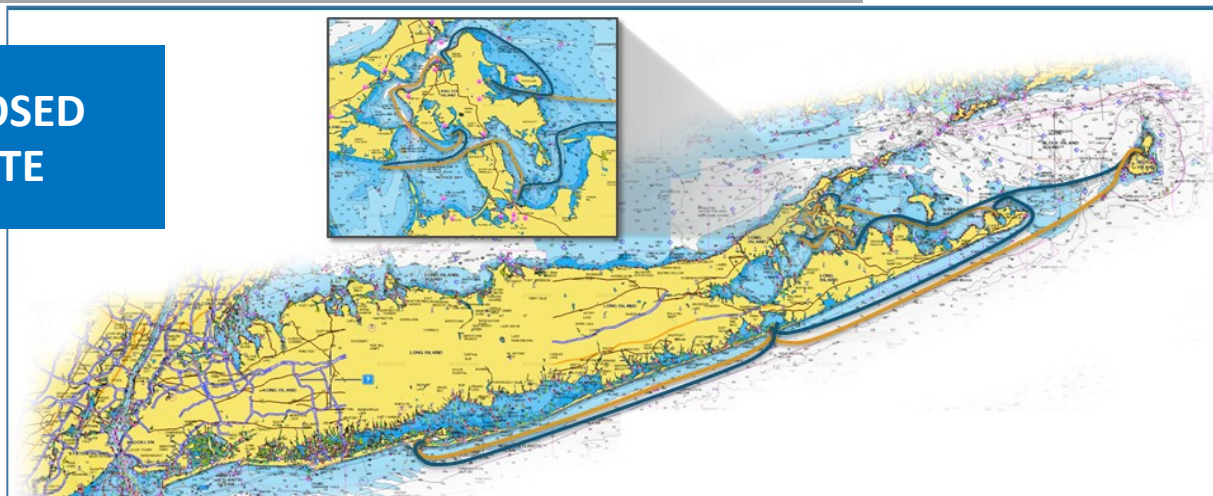

The Club's Website—www.sbccsail.org

The SBCC website has been updated to use a more modern style, which will be easier to manage and update faster. There are links that connect this site with the new Regatta site that went live a few weeks ago. (www.sbccracing.com)

This site can be accessed by PC or smart phone. On a phone, it best viewed in landscape mode (phone sideways).

Major enhancements to the SBCC web site:

- Slide show of some of our pictures on the home page.
- Upcoming Events will be on the right side when viewed with a PC.
- On a phone, Upcoming Events appear at the bottom.
- Email to selected Officers is accessed using a pull down menu to make it simple.
- RSVP to parties is also available—just select the party you wish to attend.
- All emails and RSVP send you a confirmation and copy of what you sent.
- All Regatta items will be available on their new site which is under the Regatta Chair control and management (www.sbccracing.com).

Here are some tricks from the web site:

Most items on the site are documents copied into the page that one can see. The items that are not done this way are items either too large to do this or make better sense to view in a PDF format. Items like the Event Schedule, when it is completed, will be in a PDF format.



This means that when you use your smart phone to view it, it is downloaded to your phone so the information is always on your phone whenever you need it. (Look in the Download feature of your phone).

So you don't need to have Internet access to view the schedule if you downloaded once to your phone. It is always there.

The Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association has been putting their 2018 schedule together, and there's been a few changes this year. See the following pages for the full calendar, and these items are worth noting:

GSBYRA Championships:

It was agreed that all boats racing in the GSBYRA Junior triple-handed, Men's, Women's, and Match Racing events will be BYO/SYO **including sails**. Those clubs desiring to use the GSBYRA sails can contact Glenn Schmidt (isailtuck182@optonline.net) and he will assign them a set of GSBYRA sails.

Revised Adult venue:

Morgan (Women's) and Fenner (Men's) Bowls Westhampton YS—August 4, 5.

A Club Race Management seminar will be held at Unqua Corinthian YC on April 7.

GSBYRA Grants

Several changes have been made to the application forms. The new forms are available on the GSBYRA web site—www.gsbyra.org.

GSBYRA Awards Dinner will be held at Unqua Corinthian YC November 17.

SAFETY—In consideration of the Northport YC fatal accident in sailing lessons, it was proposed the GSBYRA require propeller guards on all launches used by clubs in their respective programs. I was challenged regarding the GSBYRA's authority to "require."

Prop guards have been installed by several clubs e.g., NYC, WYS. I suggest that SBCC join in encouraging them to be installed wherever necessary.

The course costs \$495, but if we get 15 or more people, we will be eligible for a discount. Anyone can take the course and the test.

A Captain's License:

- allow you to take 6 paying passengers on your boat (plus captain and first mate)
- allow you to ferry boats north and south for customers
- allow you to operate fishing and sailing charters
- allow you to run a dive boat or offer sightseeing tours
- is valid for uninspected power and sailing vessels up to 100 gross tons
- is recognized in the U.S. and its possessions
- is Coast Guard approved and designed for recreational boaters wishing to increase their knowledge.

Carbonara - Two Ways

A classic in Rome's culinary tradition is pasta alla Carbonara. It is an amazingly easy dish to prepare, utilizing only a few simple ingredients. And the taste—amazing!

There are two versions of the same recipe; classic with pancetta and modern without the pancetta. The only difference in the ingredient list and the way you prepare it...is the pancetta.

Here are both versions:

MODERN CARBONARA

Ingredients:

- 3/4 cup grated Pecorino (Romano) Cheese
 - 1/4 cup Parmigiano Reggiano Cheese
 - 4 Eggs at room temperature
 - Large clove of garlic
 - 6 tablespoons olive oil
 - Fresh ground pepper
 - Salt
 - 1 lb. Mezzi Rigatoni
1. Place a large pot of lightly salted water (no more than 1 tablespoon salt) over high heat and bring to a boil. Add pasta to the water and boil until a bit firmer than al dente.
 2. In a mixing bowl, whisk together the eggs, Pecorino and Parmigiano. Season with a pinch of salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste (but be generous).



3. Heat the garlic clove in the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Once garlic is golden, remove it (DO NOT BURN THE GARLIC!). Keep skillet on burner but turn off the heat.
4. Just before pasta is ready, reserve 1 cup of pasta water. Drain pasta, add to the skillet and stir to coat.



5. Turn heat under the skillet on LOW and stir in the cheese mixture. Toss for just a few seconds then turn off the heat again. * *You play this little TURN ON/TURN OFF game until pasta is thoroughly coated, the egg is cooked and the consistency is creamy. Add a little reserved pasta water if needed for creaminess. Serve immediately as Carbonara should be eaten hot.

CLASSIC CARBONARA

Ingredients:

- 3/4 cup grated Pecorino (Romano) Cheese
 - 1/4 cup Parmigiano Reggiano Cheese
 - 4 Eggs at room temperature
 - Large clove of garlic
 - 1 tablespoon olive oil
 - 1 Cup Pancetta (thick sliced, fatty and cut in cubes)
 - Fresh ground pepper, salt
 - 1 lb. Mezzi Rigatoni
1. Place a large pot of lightly salted water (no more than 1 tablespoon salt) over high heat and bring to a boil. Add pasta to the water and boil until a bit firmer than al dente.
 2. In a mixing bowl, whisk together the eggs, Pecorino and Parmigiano. Season with a pinch of salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste (but be generous).
 3. Heat the garlic clove in the olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Once garlic is golden, remove it (DO NOT BURN THE GARLIC!).

Add the pancetta cubes and sauté until the fat dissolves and the meat is cooked but does not become crisp or hard. Keep skillet on burner but turn off the heat.

4. Just before pasta is ready, reserve 1 cup of pasta water. Drain pasta, add to skillet and stir to coat.
5. Turn heat under the skillet on LOW and stir in the cheese mixture. Toss for just a few seconds then turn off the heat again.

TURN ON/TURN OFF until pasta is thoroughly coated, the egg is cooked and the consistency is creamy. Add a little reserved pasta water if needed for creaminess. Serve immediately as Carbonara should be eaten hot.
