This **Invitational** regatta is designed for the cruising and racing sailor alike, and finishes with a friendly family rendezvous at Town of Islip's Atlantique Marina where awards will be presented.

Boats are invited to stay the night, either at the dock or on the hook. Town of Islip dock charges will apply everyone who is staying overnight. Dockage will be free for racers for 4 hours after the race

Please include the name of your vessel as well as her latest official handicap when registering. Also, please indicate if you are a member of the BSYC, SBCC or both.

DEADLINE FOR REGISTERING IS 8 PM, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 5. Boats not registering by the deadline will not be scored. If your yacht does not have a current SBCC PHRF rating, please register a few days earlier so that Handicap committee can assign one

FROM THE FLEET SURGEON

I SPOTTED THAT!!

I was with a friend this summer walking along the beach when I noticed he had a very large irregular shaped dark spot on his lower back. I said, "Did you know that you have a suspicious looking spot on your back?" He said, "I never look at my back." HMMMM. I said, "I think you should see a dermatologist, get this checked, just to be sure."

I personally have added to my schedule of doctors a dermatologist for a whole body skin check. On my first visit, I was told that I had some areas that looked suspicious. They were biopsied and it revealed pre-cancer when the results came back. Since they were caught early, the doctor used a freezing type spray to remove them. He also told me that I need to come back every 6 months because of these findings and he also found a lot of skin damage.

Years of being out in the sun with my friends hanging out at the beach in the summers using the Coppertone oil, the good old days! The Perfect Tan comes back to haunt us! Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer, but if detected early is very treatable.

There are various types of skin cancers but melanoma is the most dangerous and can be deadly. It is important to know your own body, look at any growths to see if the size, shape, color, thickness or texture has changed. Also anything that has a scab, crusts, itches, hurts or bleeds needs to be seen by a dermatologist.

Being sailors and boaters, we are always outside in the sun, so it's good to wear a hat, use protective clothing and wear sunscreen to prevent ourselves from further damage from the sun's harmful rays. And even though we check our bodies, it's important to see a dermatologist since they will look at areas we never look at or can't see, like our backs, bottom of our feet, and scalp.

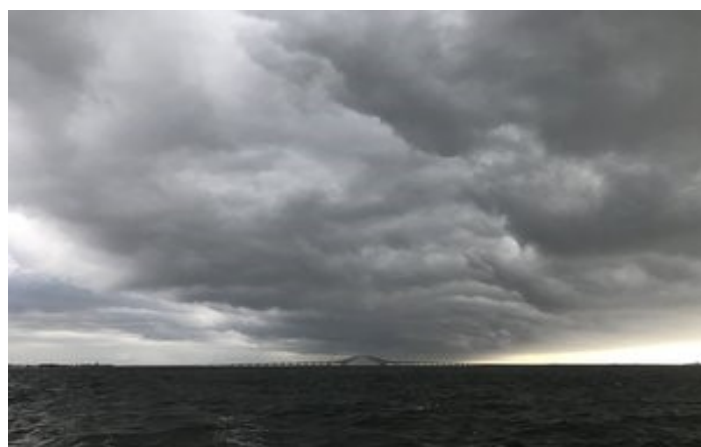
So make an appointment to see a dermatologist, report anything suspicious and let the doc do a complete body skin check, it could save your life. Your water life!!

We got lucky with East/East South East winds in the 5-10 knot range averaging around 8 knots. This was enough breeze to keep the 10 boats moving throughout the entire race under full jib and mainsail.

These conditions were favorable for the mix of crews that we saw on the water. Many boats had wives crewing including *Shadow*, *Aleboat II* and *Pandemonium*. *Pandemonium* also had grandkids pulling lines and enjoying the Saturday race. *Aleboat II* also had his 2-year-old son crewing. Thanks for coming out to make this race a decent turn out after a last-minute scramble to organize the race. Bring your best racing crew or bring your family for another great SBCC regatta either way, you will have a good time.

SEASONAL RECIPES

Orange....the color of Fall

I know I say this every year — that Fall is my favorite season, that Fall brings a wonderful harvest of fruits and vegetables, that I LOVE pumpkins.... I think it has something to do with the color! From the leaves that gently fall to the ground to the sunset colored mums in our gardens, orange is the color of the harvest with vegetables like pumpkin, sweet potatoes, carrots and butternut squash stealing the scene!

These bright-colored vegetables contain flavonoids, lycopene, potassium, vitamin C, and a very powerful antioxidant compound called beta-carotene. These nutrients are known to aid in eye health, lower the risk of certain cancers, lower blood pressure and LDL. The beta-carotenoids build healthier bones and have the ability of boosting the immune system by fighting free radicals, thus protecting our cells from damage.

So please roast some pumpkin with Rosemary and olive oil — or make some hearty sweet mashed potatoes — or sauté cubes of carrots and butternut squash in a pat of butter and finish cooking with some vegetable broth to soften them. Not only will you be eating a sweet and yummy side dish, these veggies are also low in calories!

But there is yet another orange vegetable that comes to our aid, being both delicious and healthy — the red lentil. This fiber rich legume offers us most of the health benefits of the orange veggies with an added mineral called Selenium, not present in most other foods. Selenium prevents inflammation, decreases tumor growth rates, and improves immune response to infection by stimulating the production of disease-killing T-cells. How cool is that?!

So I'd like to share my basic **red lentils recipe**. The thing to remember is that red lentils are very tiny and can be made in less than half an hour, as a side dish or a soup or as a thickener for other recipes. Not to worry if they break down and thicken — that's what they're supposed to do and that's what makes them more digestible.

Ingredients:

- 1 packet of dry red lentils - I prefer the Goya brand
- 1/2 medium sized red onion, diced
- 1 clove of garlic
- 5 or 6 Campari tomatoes, chopped
- Olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Teaspoon of Tumeric or Cardamom (optional)
- Small pot of simmering vegetable broth

In a large non-stick pan, cover the bottom of the pan with olive oil, add garlic and chopped onions, and allow to soften at low heat for approximately 8 minutes or until onion is translucent. Once onions are softened, add the chopped Campari tomatoes and sauté until they too are soft and saucy.

While the tomatoes are cooking, soak the red lentils for a few minutes in a pot of cold water. Any empty husks will float to the surface of the water and should be discarded. Drain water and add the soaked lentils to the tomato sauce. Allow the red lentils to sauté in the tomato sauce until the mixture becomes fragrant, 3 to 4 minutes.

With a ladle, transfer the simmering vegetable broth to the lentils, covering the top of the legumes by a couple of inches. Add cardamom or tumeric if using these spices.

Cover and cook over moderately low heat, stirring occasionally, until the lentils have cooked down and thickened for about 25 minutes. Add more broth if needed to finish cooking, one ladle at a time.

Once cooked, remove from heat and adjust salt and pepper to taste (when I don't add the spices, I use hot pepper to give it a little kick). Serve hot.

The cooked lentils can be made ahead and refrigerated overnight. Reheat the dish gently before serving. You can make a velvety soup by processing them with a little of the vegetable broth or add them to a recipe you already have that requires thickening.

The night I made lentils, Claudio had them as a side dish to his beloved sardines in olive oil, while I had lentils as a side to my (soy) sausage links.... but I also mixed them with some broccoli rabe. Yummy!
