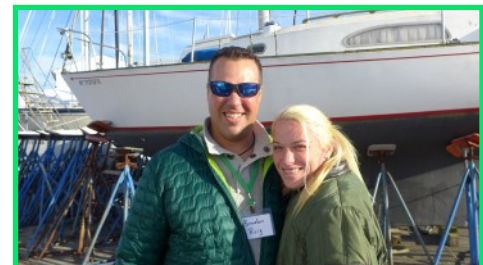
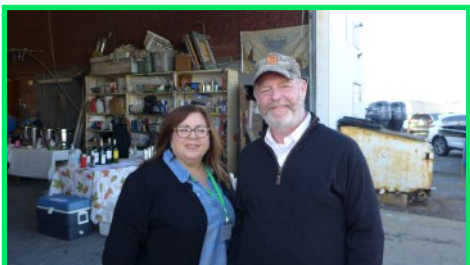

TODD'S TIPS #14 Engine Winterizing**Todd McCarthy****Plugging Your Stern Exhaust Pipe and Air Intake**

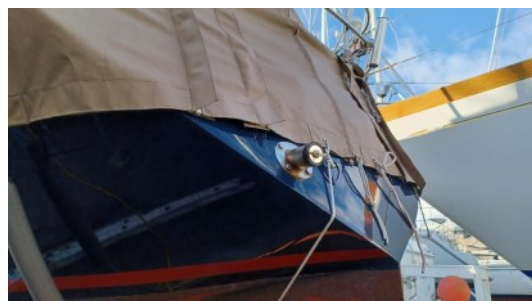
While changing my exhaust muffler hoses off season, I was really surprised at the volume and velocity of wind coming into the boat with the hoses off.

When winterizing your sailboat diesel inboard, manufacturers recommend covering both the air intake and the exhaust to prevent internal corrosion. The engine internals (valves, cylinder heads, cylinder linings, piston heads) are exposed via open intake and exhaust valves and can cause surface corrosion due to moisture in the air. Most boats I see in the yard don't follow this. You may never have a problem, but it could cause a slow deterioration of your engine internals over time that you may not notice season to season. It's simple enough to do!

A plastic bag with a tie wrap will do over the air intake as they are usually not a regular size. This will work also for the stern exhaust tube, but I have started using a rubber pool line plug (size number 10.) It fits perfectly and can be tightened via the wing nut at the top. These plugs are designed to plug 1 1/2" pool lines for winterizing, and are available at almost any pool store, or online. They are reusable and last forever. They also come in smaller size #9 and a multi size #1-5. I keep it in my nav station table compartment so I don't have to search for it.

Just remember to remove these before starting your engine for the first time in the spring.

ADDING SPRITZ TO THE HOLIDAYS

This season I thought I'd dedicate some time to finding the right cocktail starters for our holiday gatherings. I needed an aperitif that was flavorful, satisfying, and festive. And seeing that we put a lot of effort into preparing our traditional holiday meal, I wanted to find a cocktail that stimulates the appetite and makes everyone good and hungry. My cocktail recipes required that they be easy to make for both a formal sit down dinner or a New Year's Eve impromptu get together. My research led me to discover the Spritz!

Light, refreshing, and ultra-simple to make, the Spritz's bubbly quality comes from its main ingredient, Prosecco. Prosecco is known as the prince of bubbly (the king being champagne!) and is the bubbly of choice throughout the holiday season. The two different types of Prosecco are Brut (dry) and Extra Brut (semi-dry and sweeter). I like to use both types, depending upon how sweet or not my ingredients are.

Bubbly and refreshing, the Spritz can be made with Prosecco and some simple ingredients, or you can add some liquor to give it a bit of a kick! I've chosen my favorites and had fun trying each one!

APEROL SPRITZ

- 3 parts Prosecco (Brut)
- 2 parts Aperol (or Campari if you like it very bitter)
- Splash of San Pelligrino Orangina (or plain sparkling water)
- A few cubes of ice
- A thick slice of orange

Drop 3 to 4 ice cubes into a stemless wine glass. Pour in the Prosecco, the Aperol, and top with a splash of Orangina (well shaken) or sparkling water. Stir gently and drop in the orange slice.



LUXARDO SPRITZ (with Vodka)

- 3 parts Prosecco (Brut)
- 1 part homemade Cherry Vodka (recipe below)
- Splash of soda water

Luxardo cherries on a toothpick - (Luxardo is the original maraschino cherry. It is made in Italy with candied Marasca cherries and Marasca syrup. You can only buy them at Italian food stores, but they are SSOOOO worth the drive to get them!)

The Cherry Vodka is made by using any cherry jam you like. Take 3/4 cup of the jam, add 2 teaspoons of hot water, and allow jam to loosen up. Once jam is loose, add 2 cups of plain vodka, 2 tablespoons (or more) of Luxardo cherry syrup and stir gently with a wooden spoon. Once this mixture is ready, just add all the ingredients together:

Drop 3 to 4 ice cubes into a stemless wine glass and add 3 parts of the Prosecco. Spoon in the Cherry Vodka to taste and top off with a splash of soda water. Drop in the cherries on a toothpick. Don't forget to eat the wonderful cherries on your toothpick!
