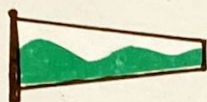

FROM THE MASTHEAD

Much water has flowed under the keel since our launching in 1951. Now, with five exciting years of fun and experience behind us, it would be well to look at our wake, determine our present position, and think of the course that lies ahead.

From a very modest beginning our membership has swelled to 230, we now have a fleet of 132 boats, and we are still growing. In many ports along the coast, from the Chesapeake Bay to the Canadian Maritimes, the green and white burgee has been flown, recognized, and welcomed as a respected representative of organized yachting. We have afforded great fun to many sailors and their families, and a number of our boats were acquired by virtue of that fact.

As we have grown in strength we have gained in influence, and thereby yachting on the Great South Bay has been given a much needed shot in the arm. In becoming a member of the Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association we have extended our activities, and have made definite progress toward the achievement of our objectives. That this was a logical development is self-evident, for anything we can or may do to stimulate interest in sailing in general must of necessity result in greater interest in the Cruising Club itself.

But in this, or any other organization, success is not measured by the size of its membership or the quality of its public relations. A more revealing criterion would be the extent to which the members participate in and enjoy its activities. In this respect we have been considerably less successful. Fewer than 40% of our fleet have actually taken part in our scheduled events and shared in the fun. We believe this situation can and will be improved as more members become aware of the pleasures and adventures that come with active participation.

Our program for 1956 provides a well-balanced schedule of activities — social, cruising and racing. To top it off you have the ever-popular rendezvous, which are rapidly becoming our most effective instruments for the promotion of lasting friendships. Members who are not interested in racing should note that the post-race rendezvous is just as important as the race itself, so they too, can join in the festivities.

Finally, whenever you see two or more boats lashed together at a mooring under the green and white burgee, remember this: it is an open invitation to come alongside, let your hair down and relax — to renew old friendships and make new ones. Then, and only then, can you fully realize what it means to be a member of the South Bay Cruising Club.

PROGRAM for 1956

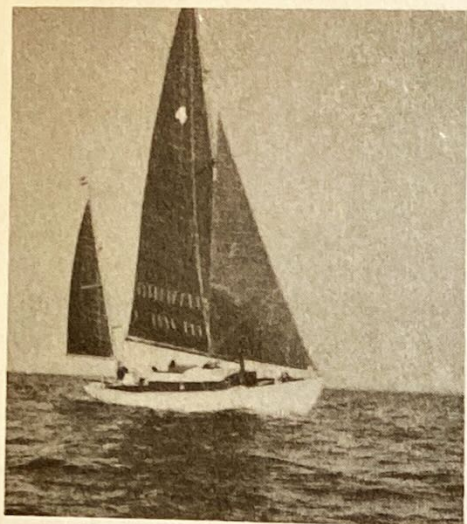

FOURTH ANNUAL CRUISE

Strange as it may seem, 14 boats started on the club cruise and 16 boats finished it! Somewhere down East we acquired 2 new members, Dr. R. C. Hunt in "TOPPER," and Harry Tzucanow in "HOPE." Considering some of the more sensational incidents of the cruise, and the behavior-pattern of some of the participants, it was very fitting that Doc Hunt should happen to be a psychiatrist!

Smith's Point was the official point of departure, and all during the night of July 15 the boats groped their way in through a gloomy drizzle to a sheltered anchorage. At 0800 next morning under a sunny sky and with a fair wind the cruise was under way, led by Cruise Chairman Merritt Smith in Katinka. The following boats comprised the fleet:

On arrival at Canoe Place in mid-afternoon the boats de-masted and locked through the Canal in a downpour, to spend the night in Sebonac Harbor. All except Reverie, Maumac, Morning Star and Extra Dry, who were to take the outside route via Shinnecock Inlet around Montauk, to rendezvous in Three Mile Harbor later on.

Sunday was spent in Sebonac cleaning up and dehydrating, and all day the fleet was under attack by wave after wave of dive-bombing green-flies. With fair wind out of the Northwest on Monday, they sailed all the way to Three Mile Harbor. Here they were joined by Maumac, Extra Dry and Morning Star. Only Reverie was missing. Seems that once out of Shinnecock Inlet she took off hell-bent for Block Island and points East.

Tuesday morning Katinka II hauled out at Maidstone Boat Yard for repairs to damaged prop, while the rest took on supplies and the Fleet Surgeon patched up the wounded. After a lazy afternoon in the lee of Gardiners Island, the fleet threaded its way into Coeckles Harbor for an evening ashore and dinner at the Inn. Shore clothes were broken out, and 38 immaculately dressed gentlemen and ladies sat down to a steak dinner amid considerable hilarity. This was an evening to remember, and everyone had fun. However, getting back aboard the boats was no mean accomplishment — the Patterson's did it the hard way.

Wednesday morning the fleet ran up to Greenport for supplies. At noon they shoved off for Long Beach Point and a beach party, while Morning Star, Maumac and Extra Dry headed for Plum Gut. Here goodby's were said, Extra Dry bound for Essex, Maumac and Morning Star homeward bound the long way, up the Sound.

Thursday the remaining boats sailed back to Sebonac for a fish fry in the evening on the beach. The festivities were enlivened when Beinert walked into the fire in his bare feet. The Fleet Surgeon rendered first aid, and when the excitement quieted down it was apparent that the patient was feeling no pain.

Friday saw the boats through the Canal and to Westhampton in time for cocktails and dinner ashore. Saturday the long haul home began in the heaviest weather the cruise had encountered, and some took 2 days, arriving home Sunday to resume the sordid existence of normal living.

In retrospect, the Fourth Annual Cruise was a real success — in fact it was the best yet held. No one got into real trouble, everyone had a lot of fun, and what is most important, all gained valuable experience that will be useful in future cruises.

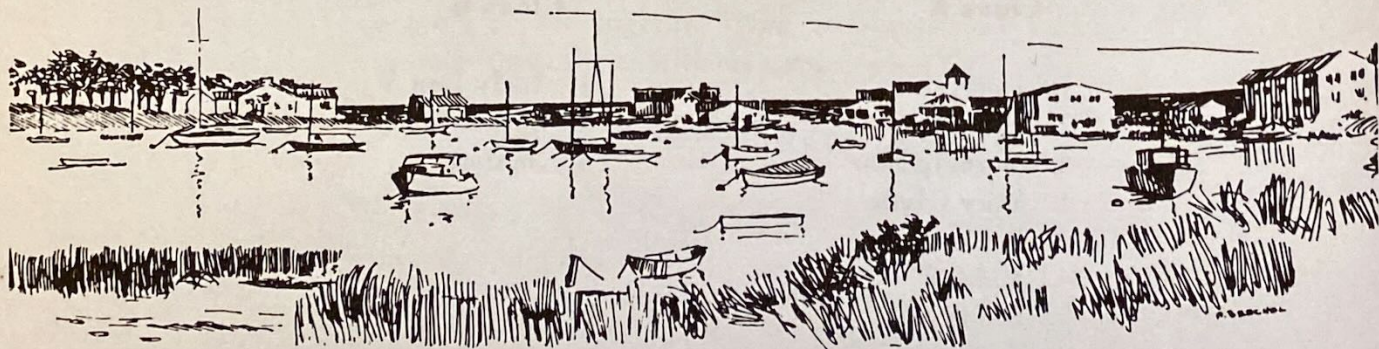
