Racing Information

Guns are at five minute intervals. Cone or flag will be lowered 30 seconds before each gun. Starting sequence is Warning gun, Preparatory gun, Class C start, Class B start, Class A start, Class S start, Class M start, Class X start.

Recall and other signals will be flown from the race committee boat and will be announced by two guns. Signal flag "R" (yellow cross on red field) means sail the reverse course. Signal flag "O" (red and yellow) means race called off. Signal flag "S" (white field, blue square) means course shortened, finish here. Signal flag "P" (blue field, white square) means start postponed. Warning gun fired 30 seconds after signal is lowered means postponements for 15 minute periods.

Class "S" yachts must fly a red streamer from the leech of the mainsail. Failure to do so will result in disqualification. Class "M" yachts fly a blue streamer.

Ex one-design yachts sailing in SBCC class "X" will derive handicaps from the Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association by application to George J. Smith, 57 Melbury Road, Babylon, L. I. These handicaps will make the yachts eligible to sail in all GSBYRA sanctioned events in the handicap classes. When sailing in SBCC events they will sail in Class "X".

NARRASKETUCK INVITATION RACE—Time and course to be announced.

BAY SHORE INVITATION: WARNING Gun—1300. Start established by Committee Boat off Lawrence Creek; to Nun No. 6, East of Captree Bridge; to Red Flashing No. 4, off Nicoll Point; return to finish line, leaving Flashing No. 1, off Bayberry Point, Islip, to starboard. Leave all other marks to Port.

BABYLON INVITATION: WARNING Gun—1300. Start established by Committee Boat off the Babylon Yacht Club; first to a B. Y. C. race marker or markers designated by the race committee (for a windward start), or directly through the center span of Captree Bridge to Flashing Red No. 2, South of Champlin Creek, Islip, leaving Nun No. 6 and Flashing Red No. 10 to Starboard; to Black and White Flasher off Great Cove, Bay Shore; return to finish through the center span of the Bridge. Leave all marks to Port.

LADIES' DAY RACE: WARNING Gun—1300. Start established by Committee Boat east of Babylon Y. C. towards the bridge, and the course will be out to the black flasher buoy at the head of the Oak Beach Channel off Babylon, through the bridge to Nun No. 6, back through the bridge to the finish line, which will be in the vicinity of the start. All marks will be taken to port.

WEST ISLAND RACE: WARNING Gun—1300. Start established by Committee Boat in Nicoll Bay; passing around Red Flashing No. 10 off Bay Shore; Red-Black Quick Flash off Saltaire (keeping North of Flashing Red No. 8, regardless of which direction course is sailed); Flashing Green No. 15 off Point O'Woods; return to finish line established by Committee Boat in Nicoll Bay. All marks left to Port. Course may be sailed in the opposite direction, with all marks left to Starboard.

GSBYRA RACE WEEK: Courses for Cruising Class Races will be in Race Week Program.

OCEAN RACE: Time and course to be announced.

FOULKE TROPHY RACE: WARNING Gun—1800. Start established by Committee Boat in proximity of Flashing No. 7 in mid-Bay off Babylon Cove; through center span of Captree Bridge; keeping North of Flashing Red No. 32 off Patchogue Bay; round Flashing Green No. 1 off Howells Point to Port; returning up the Bay, keeping North of Flashing Red No. 32, through center span of Captree Bridge to finish at line established by committee boat off Babylon Cove. Proper running lights must be used.

SMITH TROPHY RACE: WARNING Gun—1400. Start established by Committee Boat off Sayville; to Flashing Red No. 18 off Point O'Woods; to Flashing Green No. 1 off Patchogue Bay; return to finish; leaving all marks to Port.

COMMODORE'S CUP RACE: WARNING Gun—1300. Start established by Committee Boat in Nicoll Bay; to Flashing Red No. 4 off Nicoll's Point leaving it to Port; to a finish line established by the Committee Boat in the vicinity of Howells Point.

BABYLON Y. C. FALL SERIES—Time and course to be announced.

SINGLE-HANDED CREEPSTAKES: Time and course to be announced.

Cruising Information

There are many cruising activities planned for the 1966 season as you can see by the schedule. We have published a Cruising Guide for the first time and are hopeful that it will be very useful to the members. Look for more details on the various cruising events and the Annual Cruise in the Cruising Guide and in the Mastheads.

The premier event of the cruising season is, of course, the Annual Cruise. An Annual Cruise Award with the yacht's name engraved on it will be presented to all yachts participating in at least one week of the Annual Cruise. A Green Water Award will be presented to all yachts accumulating at least 7 points during the season. Points are awarded only for overnight cruising activities as indicated on the schedule. Basically the system is one point for each night aboard, with the exception that the Annual Cruise will only count for one point. This will make it easy for someone who does not go on the Annual Cruise to still win an award. Season cruising trophies will be presented to the boats accumulating the most points for the season in addition to being on the Annual Cruise.

Each organized cruising activity will have a designated "Cruise Committee Boat". There will be a log or register on that boat which it will be necessary to sign in order to get credit for that activity. Only the skipper can sign—no one can sign for him. Signing the log should be an ideal opportunity to meet other skippers, particularly for the newer members.

SBCC — Suggested Equipment List for Offshore Cruising and Racing

Many of these items should also be aboard for sailing in protected waters.

1. One USCG approved life preserver, jacket or vest type, per person.
2. One hand or mouth operated fog horn (freon or electric may be additional).
3. One fog bell.
4. Side lights visible one mile and stern light visible two miles and sufficient power source. Lights to be so mounted that they will not be obscured by any sails to be carried.
5. A suitable flotation device or combination of devices to take off the entire crew, i.e. solid raft, automatically-inflated rubber raft, or dinghy, with sufficient buoyancy even when swamped.
6. One (preferably two) man overboard device (life ring or horseshoe type) within reach of helmsman with automatic water light and whistle attached.
7. Compass strongly mounted and properly compensated.
8. Suitable charts, navigation tables, and equipment for the waters sailed.
9. Radar reflector.
10. One hand operated high capacity bilge pump.
11. Two anchors and suitable length cables.
12. First aid equipment and instruction book.
13. Red parachute flares—minimum of six.
14. Powerful searchlight.
15. At least one waterproof flashlight.
16. Safety belts and lanyards for all crew members.
17. One gallon of water per person.
18. Stores sufficient for three days.
19. All hatches, ports or other openings giving access to the cabin or interior of the hull should be so constructed and secured as not to carry away or admit dangerous quantities of water in the event of a knockdown or swamping. Hatches and skylights should be secured to the hull with a lanyard to prevent loss overboard.
20. Self bailing cockpit—no water should be able to enter the interior of the hull if the cockpit is filled to deck level.
21. Double row of lifelines at least 24" high, upper lifeline must be wire rope.
22. Operable seacocks on all underwater fittings.
23. Name of yacht painted on all floatable gear.
24. Roller reefing equipment on main boom or suitable reefing gear rove in place.

Review of 1965 Activities

The yachting year opened almost as soon as the calendar year, with Fred Becker's annual hangover cruise for hardy Babylonians on the "Widgeon" January 1st and soon thereafter the "Morning Star's" unguided voyage to the bottom of the sea in Sayville—happily without Hervey. The first official event was, of course, the January Annual Meeting at La Grange Inn, with the election of officers, awards of permanent trophies, and the first of Cecil B. de Paterson's annual productions. The March meeting was movies-and-slides night for the amateurs, and was followed by Lobster John's brilliant legal dissertation on Seduction at Sea and related subjects important to boatowners. In April Everett Morris came out to help our skippers develop the program for taking part in the first Block Island Week. Entertainment Chairman Charlie Collis began a series of successful parties in May at the Bay Shore Yacht Club and at the June meeting Alf Loomis regaled us with his skillful and humorous narration accompanying "Tall Ships, Twelves, and Other Racers."

The season's yachting activities started with a beautiful Commissioning Day May 30 at the Babylon Yacht Club, with 32 auxiliaries, 12 stinkpotters, and a group including the boatless commodore and other assorted freeloading members. The first race, Narresketuck, was jinxed by weather again, even though switched from September in 1964 to June, and iron-man Chester Phipps in the wooden ship "Peregrinator" was our only finisher of 15 starters. 39 sailed in 4 divisions at Bay Shore June 26. In Class A Mo Goldsmith, Stewart Greene, and Alex Yaxis were the top 3; Charlie Collis, Frank Lyons, and Bob Ellner led in Class B; Bill Bradt, John Wragge, and Harry Wilburger in C; and Jay Lethin, Dr. John Ruppe, and Paul Schwindt in S.

The Babylon Y. C. Invitation on Saturday of the July 4th Weekend was fairly rough, and the leaders were Jack Rettaliata in A, Ram de Murias and Fred Eggerstedt in B, and Paul Schwindt, Bill Cook, and Al Heckel in S. The following day was nicer and thirty ladies sailed the course. All did beautifully and the Mesdames Hanaway, Henderson (Miss Kate), and Paterson (Maggie) in C, Ellner, Collis, and Evans in B, Goldsmith, Brayshaw, and Yaxis in A, and Van Denburg, Cook, and Seidenspinner in S were the winners. The following weekend the same miserable weather that marred our Block Island Feeder Race and the start of the Annual Cruise held the Bayberry Invitation to one day, with Van Denburg and Schwindt leading the six Class S boats, and only two other finishers—Jack Rettaliata in A and Paul Rosensweig in B.

Dense fog and rough seas allowed only Boyd Max in "Lively Lady" to start the Friday night feeder race to Block Island July 9 off Fire Island Inlet. A surprising number of boats found their way into Sore Thumb after dark in the fog, and Bob Garben in "Snow Goose", Bill Milligan in "T'ing Hao", and Dick Boyd in "Nor'easter" went outside to Shinnecock the next day. 36 boats made the cruise and most made Mystic, in two groups—the latter one taking part the following weekend in SBCC Day, with Hervey Smith presenting a painting to the Seaport, the Burgee being hoisted at the NYYC Station, and a fine cocktail party enlivened by Doc Hamlin's dramatic arrival in the middle of a rainstorm. The second week of the cruise enjoyed some beautiful, clear, dry weather for a change, and for most, after various separate cruises to Narragansett Bay, Provincetown, Block Island, Shelter Island, and the Connecticut River and various groundings in Moriches Bay, the cruise ended with the West Island Race Weekend at Great River.



46 raced around East and West Fire Islands July 24, with the top performers being Bob Schafer, Harry Wilburger, and Tom Hanaway in C; George Evans, Paul Rosensweig, and Charlie Collis in B; Dick Nehring, Ed Farrell, and Boyd Max in A; and Ralph Logan, King Van Denburg, and Bill Cook in S. The Deale Memorial Trophy for the best overall time on performance basis was won by Dr. John Ruppe in "Gemini" and the Schnur Perseverance Trophy by John Wragge in "Bay Bee". The turnout totalled 50, and a large number stayed for the rendezvous afterwards and the free-flowing champagne party Sunday at the raft-up, which is now a permanent part of the schedule.

At Race Week, in two days off Sayville and one in Bellport Bay, Al Heckel, Paul Schwindt, and Mack Boettger led Class S and Jack Rettaliata led the A-B-C group. The Ocean Race on August 7 had a turnout of 19 in three classes, with Al Heckel, Bill Cook, and Wes Stone leading S; Bob Ellner, Paul Rosensweig, and George Evans in Class B; and Mo Goldsmith and Jack Rettaliata in A.

The Foulke Trophy Race on the 14th was drifting and dreaming. The silverware went to those in the right place, mainly in the lead, that is, when the wind shifted to the west in the wee hours on the leg home. Most of the fleet had a fine outing on this race, with cocktails, suppers, and breakfasts in the most comfortable of seas. Bill Cook, Ed Neale, Jr., and King Van Denburg took Class S; Joe Hack, Boyd Max, and Henry Tilden won in A; and Bob Ellner, Chester Phipps, and Ed Wimmerstedt in B. Two highly unusual events took place in this race. One—no black spinnakers were reported. The other—Commodore-to-be Roger Ramsdell, unaware that commodores are traditionally chosen by drinking rather than sailing prowess—most, in fact, have been top contenders





for the Schnur and Sympatico trophies—shocked everyone and won in Class C, followed by Lloyd Dobkin. Jack Saxe, in "Nirvana", won the Foulke Trophy, and Julien Davies, a past vice-commodore himself, copped the Sympatico Trophy decisively.

Stormy weather again dogged us on the racing weekend of August 28-29. On Saturday, 28 starters were enjoying the Smith Trophy Race until a thunderstorm hit and only 13 were able to finish. Boyd Max won in A, Bob Ellner in B, Ray Davis and Bob Dunlop in C, and Al Heckel, Bill Cook, and Ralph Logan in S. It's an ill wind that blows no good and fortunately several of our fleet out in the storm were on hand to assist some of the smaller one-design boats of the host Wet Pants Association returning home from a regatta at Domino. The continued bad weather kept most of the fleet holed up at the rendezvous at Great River the next day, and only a disappointing 2 boats made the Queen of the Bay Race, whose host club, Sayville, had included a Cruising Division for the first time, won by Ralph Logan.

Labor Day Weekend was quite successful, with 36 yachts in the Commodore's Race, 23 at the Smith's Pt. Rendezvous aside from the others at Bellport, 15 in the Cruising Race back to Great River Sunday, and 27 at the rendezvous there that evening. Hervey Smith was the chief attraction with the best double of the season—a somersault down the companionway followed by an encore of a trip overboard.

The Children's Day Rendezvous with Babylon Sept. 12 at Whirlpool Pt. was dampened by a cold nor'easter but the kids had a fine time anyway. Julien Davies clinched the SBCC Character Cup with an exercise in Sunfish sailing attired in the best tradition in yacht club tie and blazer. The 3-day Babylon Y. C. Fall Series over that and the following weekend attracted 12 in the Cruising Division, with Bob Paterson winning in C, Chester Phipps in B, Jack Rettaliata in A, and Al Heckel in S.

On the 25th we had fine weather for the Clambake, which was another Collis triumph, and 39 yachts turned out for the Single-Handed Creepstakes. Mo Goldsmith, Stewart Greene, and Boyd Max won in A; Dick Brown, John Beinert, and Paul Rosensweig in B; Bill Bradt and Bob Schafer in C; and Al Heckel, Bill Cook, and King Van Denburg in S.

Columbus Day Weekend had a high of 61 boats at Cedar Beach and 5 stayed through Tuesday, joined by 6 returnees for a beautiful final day. It was a typically enjoyable 56 degree, 86 proof Fall Cruise.

The Fall Cocktail Party at Cedar Lane Boatyard was outstanding, and the trophies were numerous and beautiful, with some visiting commodores on hand to present their invitational awards. Boyd Max made a fine challenge for the club swimming championship later in the evening but it was too late in the season to catch up to Hervey.

In GSBYRA activities, our Grace Beinert was undefeated in winning the Great South Bay Women's Championship, with her crew of Nancy Davison, Paula Mann, and Nonette Schafer. Art Flynn, the Beinerts and Beckers, and Ev Seidenberg were the Race Committee on the "Widgeon" for the SBCC-operated Juniors portion of the YRA championships. The club did not have an entry but the winning skipper, Peter Tarr of Babylon Y. C., most of his crew, and two other skippers were from Cruising Club families. In outside area campaigning Ray Miligi with "Seal" and Bob Lawrence, Paul Schwindt, and Al Heckel in crew, and Jack Young with Fred Becker along aboard "Courtisan" were active in eastern L. I. waters. Jack took a prize in the Ram Island Y. C. Fishers Island Race, sailed in the Annapolis-Newport Race, and is an entrant in this year's Bermuda Race.









The much-enlarged cruising program with cruise-rendezvous weekends and informal races was most successful, highlights being the Great River Beach Party in June, the cruise-race back to Great River Labor Day Weekend, and another from Babylon in September. 14 skippers earned cruising award plaques, Captains Berdolt, Cook, Flynn, Garben, Goldsmith, Logan, Peck, Ramsdell, Rosenberg, Ryan, Smith, Thayer, Worden, and Yaxis. A special cruising award was presented to Ed Macy for his trip to Maine waters in the "Reverie", and the Blue Water Award was presented to Stuart Baldwin for his round-trip voyage to Bermuda in the "Gardaloo."

The winners of season's racing championships for cruising class boats were: GSBYRA Season's Performance Trophy, based on 50% Race Week standing and 50% average standing in 3 of the 5 invitation races of YRA member clubs—Paul Schwindt, "Aries".

Babylon Y. C. Season's Performance Trophy, based 50% on BYC July 4th Regatta and 50% on BYC Fall Series standing—Al Heckel, "Falcon".

SBCC Governors Cup, a new permanent trophy presented by the 1965 Board of Governors, based on the best combined times in the West Island Race, the Foulke Trophy-Night Race, and the Commodore's Race—Bill Cook, "Merry Ann".

Henry Post and Al Salazar, as chairman and secretary of the South Shore Preservation Committee, put forth a tremendous effort in rallying bay com-

munity support to have the proposed east-west channel placed in a straight-line, relatively mid-bay position most conducive to the flushing action desired and beneficial to along-shore boating safety. Unfortunately, for reasons unknown and unexplained to us, this location was not designated. The result to date is a bent east-west channel which hopefully will give some flushing action but which will end at its eastern terminus too close to shore and in too shallow water for the Town of Islip to desire to continue it through the Captree Bridge to connect with the deeper inlet-approach channels to the east.

Handicaps

As in all human activities, cruising can be more fun with a dash of competition—there is nothing quite like coming in ahead, whether by going faster, or farther, or longer, or in worse weather! Thus, though the *raison d'être* of the South Bay Cruising Club is Cruising Under Sail, still much of the interest and program of the Club have at their core some Essence of Competition, be it a formal race complete with committee boat, guns, marks, standard rules, protest flags—and cups, or a dinghy-do around the fleet at a rendezvous.

Competition in a yacht club, however, always dredges up that eternal bugaboo of sailboat racing—how in the name of Old Poseidon himself do you arrange a competition between different kinds of sailboats that proves anything except bigger boats usually go faster. Hence—Handicaps.

To have handicaps, though, there must be a basis on which to handicap—and here the Club splits. There are the comfortable cruising types looking for a friendly competition to add spice and interest to what is essentially cruising, complete with barnacles, baggy sails, and bailing buckets. And then there are the hard-nosed racing types who will gleefully jettison the head, the stove, the bunks, and the cook, and pack hiking ballast into their life-jackets, just to pick up that silver.

To meet the needs and desires of both types, in this club handicap ratings are established in two different ways: by Performance and by Measurement.

Classes A, B, and C

First, every boat in the fleet for which there are racing results is automatically given a Performance Rating based upon the average of its performance with respect to the mean of each race in which it has participated.

All of the Permanent Fleet Trophies are awarded under this system.

To establish the Ratings, the results of each race are analysed by first averaging the times of all participants to find the Mean Elapsed Time of the race. Then the Mean Time of the race is divided by the time of each participant, in turn, expressing the results in per cent for each boat.

The accumulated data on each participant for all races on record since 1957 are posted in a Race Record Book, and a Handicap Factor for each boat is figured by casting out the lowest 25% of its performances and averaging the remainder. The result is the percentage faster or slower than average the boat may be **expected** to perform.

In a given race, the Corrected Time of each boat is obtained simply by multiplying its Elapsed Time by its Handicap Factor, and the winner is the one whose Corrected Time is least. If every boat sailed exactly as predicted, the Corrected Times of all boats in the event would be the same.

The Performance Handicap System is intended primarily to foster and encourage participation by Cruising Types, and is designed and administered specifically to make it as easy as possible for anyone to participate in the events. No prior notice or measurement of any kind is required—it is only necessary to appear on the course in three events to obtain a rating.

Of course, only boats with established ratings can qualify for trophies. However, the Race Committee reports the Elapsed Time of every boat appearing

on the course, with a suitable identifying number, to the Handicap Chairman, and, after a boat has appeared in three events, its Performance Rating is automatically calculated and added to the list. Hence, a boat coming into the fleet or one which has not raced previously with the Club simply picks the Class in which it seems to belong and races with it, with the understanding that it will be marked NH (No Handicap) until it has appeared in three events.

The Classes A, B, and C are established by listing the boats in the order of their ratings, and dividing the list arbitrarily into thirds. A Table of Handicap Factors with the divisions into Classes is published in the Masthead prior to the first race, and is updated in subsequent issues during the summer as new data accumulates.

Class S

Owners who prefer racing under a measurement rule system may elect Class S or Class M. For S the owner requests measurement under the Storm Trysail Rule from the Measurement Chairman, and obtains another rating, based solely on the measurement (in addition to his Performance Rating), which qualifies him to race for Class S trophies with results judged by the Measurement Ratings. Boats racing in Class S compete for the overall Permanent Fleet Trophies, however, on the basis of the Performance Ratings.

The Storm Trysail Measurement Rule provides a Rating Number reflecting how the boat is expected to perform according to the formula:

$$R = 0.15 \times \frac{L \sqrt{SA}}{3 \sqrt{D}} \times PA$$

where L = Adjusted Waterline
SA = Adjusted Sail Area
D = Displacement
PA = Propeller Allowance

L, SA, and PA are "adjusted values" derived from the actual measured values by certain formulae established by the Storm Trysail Club, which are presumed to take into account differences in rig and hull shape.

In Class S, handicaps are figured in terms of an allowance of so many seconds per mile, as determined from the yacht's Storm Trysail Rating through the North American Yacht Racing Union Time Allowance Tables.

Class M

Yachts with valid Midget Ocean Racing Club (MORC) Rating Certificates are qualified to race in Class M. To be eligible for this class, the owner must have a valid MORC Rating obtained on his own initiative from a recognized MORC Measurer. Handicaps in Class M are figured on the basis of an allowance of seconds per mile, from the MORC Rating through the NAYRU Tables.

As in Class S, competition for fleet-wide trophies is based on the Performance System.

Boats electing to race in Class S or in Class M under a measurement rating must notify the Regatta Committee each season, prior to the first race which they enter, and they are required to remain in the elected class for the season.

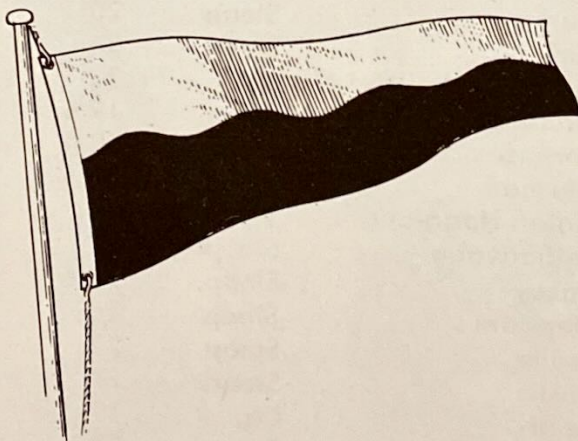

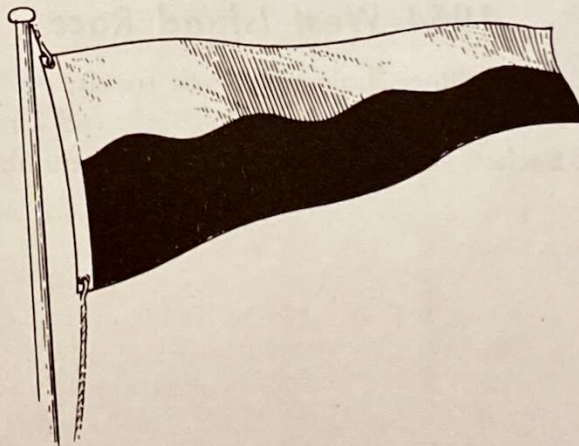

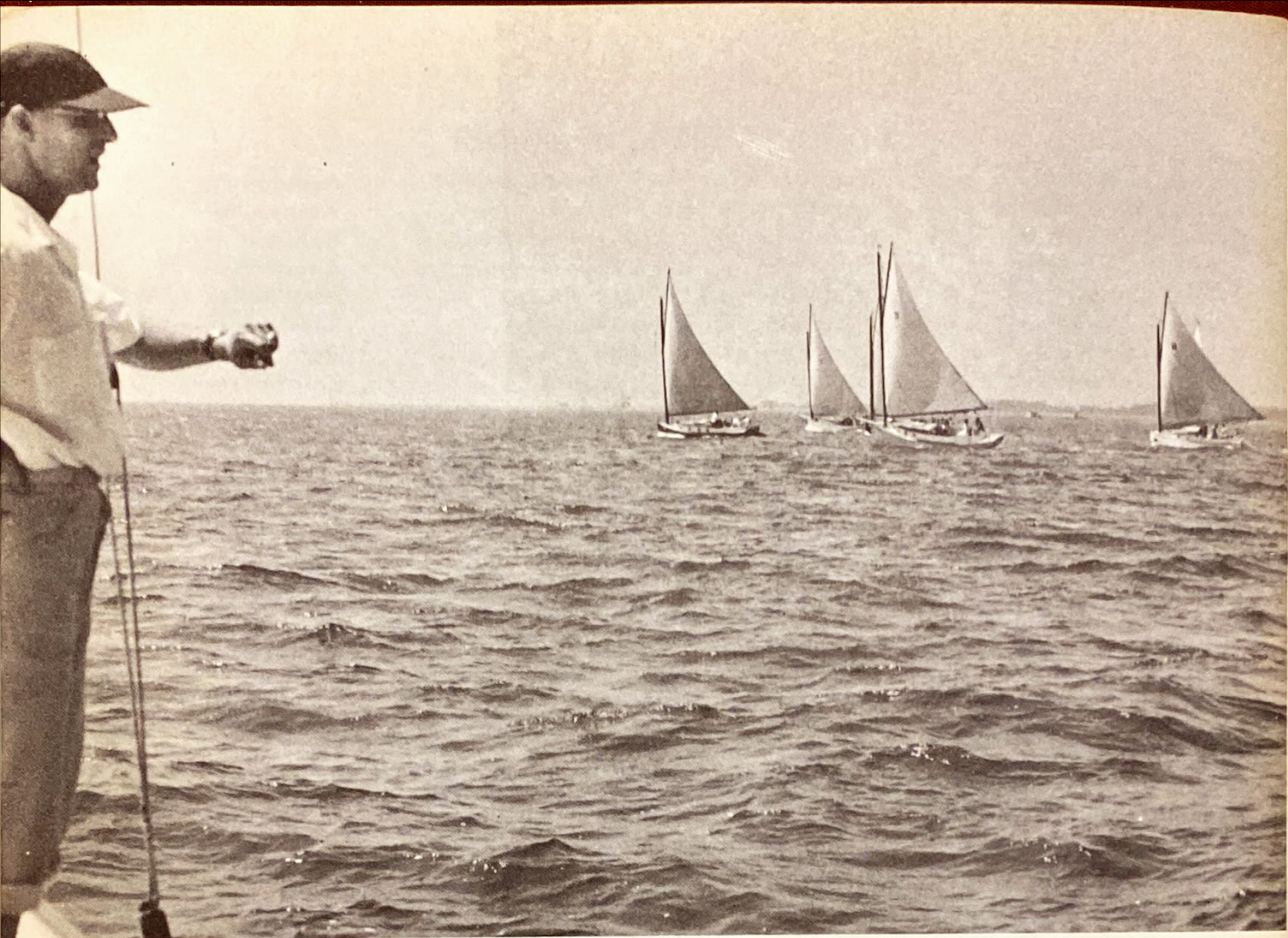
